- Letter of recommendation* – This must be from a psychology, biology, or neuroscience faculty member other than your intended Lois Pope mentor (1 page)

THE PROGRAM

The Lois Pope program requires that you spend an average of 40 hours per week in supervised research activity. Lois Pope scholars can elect to participate in the PRIME program as PRIME Adjuncts, which would allow them to attend all PRIME meetings and supplemental events (Note: These meetings will take place on Wednesdays from 2:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m.). As a PRIME Adjunct you are also eligible to participate in the welcoming luncheon (TBD) and the poster session (TBD). Be sure to keep this in mind when you plan summer jobs and classes.

CHOOSING A MENTOR

You must choose a mentor before you apply to Lois Pope. Not all research faculty will offer Lois Pope experiences this summer. Be sure to check with your preferred faculty member as soon as possible.

FUNDING

Lois Pope students are awarded a summer stipend (\$5000). Students who receive and accept Lois Pope funding may not accept additional funding from any other source.

Previous Lois Pope Summer Fellow awardees are ineligible to apply.

OTHER FUNDING SOURCES

We hope to provide a comprehensive summer research experience for as many students as possible. Because Lois Pope funds are limited, we ask that you investigate other sources of funding within the University (several of these are listed below); this will maximize the number of students who can take advantage of the Lois Pope program. Students who receive funding from other sources and wish to make the most of their summer research experience can participate in Lois Pope as a Lois Pope Adjunct.
